

Man caught with 1,000 stolen EGGS in his fridge after pinching them from work

- Gu stole from a food factory. What could he have taken from a different workplace?
- Gu said "I have stolen everything in my house". Do you believe him? What is there in a house, and how do you imagine Gu could have stolen it?
- Can you act out him having a friend over to his house, and seeing all this stuff?
