

Royal Mail Don't Want THIS Stuff



There are many things that the Royal Mail will not let you post.

Have a look at the list, and think about why this might be, and whose plans it would thwart.

Imagine trying to get away with sending any of these. Act out the scene in the Post Office!

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post aerosol air fresheners or oven cleaners.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post bullets.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post used bandages or plasters.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post fake bank notes or coins.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post fake postage stamps.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post used engine oil.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post party poppers.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post fireworks.

Royal Mail says you can send Christmas Crackers, but not the exploding snaps by themselves.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post nail varnish remover.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post fire-lighters or matches.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post frozen water, including packs of ice.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post gas cylinders for camping stoves.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post scuba tanks.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post fire extinguishers.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post goods made in foreign prisons.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post body parts.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post animals, either dead or alive. Dead insects, sent as collectables, *are* allowed.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post any foreign lottery tickets. (UK ones are fine.)

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post any really strong magnets.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post weed killer.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post any poisons.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post radioactive material, including waste and luminous dials from aircraft.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post waste, dirt, filth or refuse, including household waste or rubbish.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post real handguns or machine guns.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post electroshock weapons like tasers and stun guns.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post balloons filled with flammable gases. (Helium balloons are okay. Hydrogen balloons are not.)

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post more than 50 grams of poo, and **EVEN THEN** it can only be sent to a doctor, nurse, dentist, vet or laboratory.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post live bees using Second Class post.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post live caterpillars, unless the box is labelled: 'URGENT – LIVING CREATURES - HANDLE WITH CARE'.

Royal Mail says you cannot use them to post dangerous spiders.
